

## History

- 2001 / Maryland Caregivers Support Coordinating Council
- Purpose
  - Identify the needs and challenges faced by informal family caregivers caring for those across the lifespan.
  - Advocate for and empower caregivers and make recommendations for effective public policies and the coordination of services.
- Membership
  - Consist of 17 members appointed by the Governor
  - Represent state agencies, family caregivers, service providers, and advocacy groups. The Council's
  - Statute requires five family caregiver members.
  - The Maryland Department of Human Resources, as of 7/1/2017 known as the Maryland Department of Human Services (DHS), provides staff to the Council.

## History, continued

- <u>The Task Force on Family Caregiving and Long-Term Supports (2016)</u>, Chaired by Senator Delores Kelley and Delegate Angela Angel, Co-Chair, recommended that the Council's statute be enhanced by:
  - Changing the name to the Maryland Commission on Caregiving
  - Broadening the membership to include a representative from the Maryland Senate and the House of Delegates
  - Expanding the mandates of the Commission
- The Maryland General Assembly passed Bill <u>SB216</u> during the 2017 legislative session to create the Maryland Commission on Caregiving. The Bill was signed by Governor Larry Hogan on April 11, 2017

### Vision

We envision a Maryland where Caregivers provide support for their loved ones while at the same time attending to their own well-being and life balance.



## Mission

As the "Voice of the Caregiver," the Maryland Commission on Caregiving seeks to *recommend policies, address the concerns and acknowledge the contributions of Maryland Caregivers.* The Commission will engage communities to empower Caregivers with resources, respite and support.

- 1. Solicit and gather *concerns of caregivers*
- Develop and distribute to interested parties a *handbook of current respite care* and other family caregiver services available in the State
- 3. Review *successful respite care programs* in other states
- Develop a model family caregiver support program that incorporates best practices from existing programs in this and other states



- 5. Provide **ongoing analysis of best practices** in family caregiver support programs in this and in other states
- 6. **Coordinate activities** of existing and proposed family caregiver support services among State and local units
- 7. **Research available funding sources** and explore possibilities for additional funds
- 8. Identify *unmet needs and priorities* for additional funds
- 9. *Monitor and implement* the Commission's recommendations

## Successes to Date

 Collaborated with other advocacy groups for legislative outreach events in Annapolis



- Submitted testimony (oral and written) on bills pertinent to family caregiving
- Conducted Town Hall events to solicit feedback from caregivers and organized local resource fairs
- Supported DHS in applying for the Lifespan Respite Care Grant
- Developed list of training resources on <u>MCC webpage</u>
- Inclusion of caregiver module in the <u>Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System</u>
- Attended local events as presenters, exhibitors, and participants

#### National Academy for State Health Policy Learning Collaborative

- MD State Team is comprised of DDA, MDOD, MDOA, BHA, Medicaid, DHS, and Easter Seals
- Aim of the collaborative is to consider the adoption of caregiver-friendly policies for older adults in Medicaid's LTSS
- MD's work plan includes caregiver campaign video and 5 corresponding videos highlighting available respite and caregiver resources; revised Medicaid waiver fact sheets; recorded webinars from the MD Technology Assistance Program on devices that can substitute for human assistance; and purchase of additional devices for Loan Library

### 2021-2022 Areas of Focus



- Launch awareness campaign for National
- Family Caregivers Month (November): Governor proclamation, sponsored webinars, release of video
- Start the conversation about the shortage of the direct care workforce and evaluate solutions, establishing new partnerships as necessary
- Publish statewide resources on respite programs identified by the Respite Care Coalition and post to MCC webpage
- Prioritize mandates among Commission and identify action items

#### **PURPOSE of the NFCSP**

- To provide comprehensive services to informal family caregivers and grandparent family caregivers; and as a result, improve the caregiving experience and the lives of both caregivers and care-recipients.

- Minor Home Repair & Improvements (ramps, safety rails, grab bars, etc.)
- **Safety Equipment** (emergency response systems, canes, rollaters, walkers, wheelchairs, stair lifts, etc.
- Specialty Items (shoes, braces, etc.)
- Health Improvement Services (exercise classes, small/safe exercise equipment, etc.)
- Transportation
