Maryland Health Occupations Section 4-606

Article - Health Occupations

§ 4-606.

- (a) A person who practices or attempts to practice dentistry without a license in violation of § 4-601(a) of this subtitle or represents to the public in violation of § 4-602 of this subtitle that the person is authorized to practice dentistry is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to:
- (1) For a first offense, a fine not exceeding \$2,000 or imprisonment in jail not exceeding 6 months; or
- (2) For a subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$6,000 or imprisonment in the State penitentiary not exceeding 1 year.
- (b) A person who practices or attempts to practice dental hygiene without a license in violation of § 4-601(a) of this subtitle, aids or abets unauthorized practice of dental hygiene in violation of § 4-601(b) of this subtitle, or represents to the public in violation of § 4-602 of this subtitle that the person is authorized to practice dental hygiene is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.
- (c) A person who violates any provision of Subtitle 4 of this title, which relates to dental laboratory work, or who advertises a dental appliance in violation of § 4-503(c) of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,000 or imprisonment in jail not exceeding 6 months.

§ 4-601. Practicing without license; aiding or abetting unauthorized practice

- (a) Practicing without license. Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person may not practice, attempt to practice, or offer to practice dentistry or dental hygiene on a human being in this State unless licensed by the Board.
- (b) Aiding or abetting unauthorized practice of dental hygiene. -- A person may not aid or abet unauthorized practice of dental hygiene in this State.

DENTISTRY SUBTITLE 6. PROHIBITED ACTS; PENALTIES

§ 4-606. Penalties

- (a) Unauthorized practice of dentistry. --
- (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person who practices or attempts to practice dentistry without a license in violation of § 4-601(a) of this subtitle or represents to the public in violation of § 4-602 of this subtitle that the person is authorized to practice dentistry is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to:
- (i) For a first offense, a fine not exceeding \$ 5,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 1 year; or
- (ii) For a subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$ 20,000 per day or imprisonment not exceeding 5 years.
- (2) This subsection does not apply to a person who practices or attempts to practice dentistry without a license if the person's license has been expired for a period of not more than 6 months.
- (b) Unauthorized practice of dental hygiene. --
- (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person who practices or attempts to practice dental hygiene without a license in violation of § 4-601(a) of this subtitle, aids or abets unauthorized practice of dental hygiene in violation of § 4-601(b) of this subtitle, or represents to the public in violation of § 4-602 of this subtitle that the person is authorized to practice dental hygiene is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$ 1,000.
- (2) This subsection does not apply to a person who practices or attempts to practice dental hygiene without a license if the person's license has been expired for a period of not more than 6 months.
- (c) Dental laboratory work offense; advertising dental appliance. -- A person who violates any provision of Subtitle 4 of this title, which relates to dental laboratory work, or who advertises a dental appliance in violation of § 4-503(c) of this title is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$ 2,000 per day or imprisonment not exceeding 2 years.
