2024 Legislative Update

- The fiscal 2025 budget bill (SB360) and the Budget Reconciliation and Financing Act (BRFA)(SB360) made several changes that impact the Consortium.
- The BRFA creates a new allowable use for Consortium funds that aligns with its authorizing statute to maximize public funding via Medicaid.
- For fiscal year 2025 only, **up to \$12.0 million** in Consortium funds may be used for **school-based** behavioral health services, and to be used to reimburse Medicaid for school-based behavioral health services provided through Medicaid.
- The fiscal 2025 budget for Medicaid recognizes \$14.7 million in federal funds that will match consortium dollars under this new allowable use.



MDH and Consortium Partnership

- May 2023: Federal Guidance from CMS on School Based Services Guidance
- November 2023: Presented plan for implementation to full Consortium
- January 2024: Reviewed plan for implementation and request for technical assistance at Best Practices Subcommittee of Consortium
- March 2024: MDH submits federal grant proposal to support technical assistance; funding announcement is July 2024
- April 2024: FY25 Budget Reconciliation and Financing Act includes flexible use of Consortium funds to be used for school-based behavioral health services for FY25 only



Primary Behavioral Health 2 School Services

Vision

• In partnership with the Consortium on Coordinated Community Supports, implement a multi-tiered system of behavioral health supports in all public schools

Opportunities

 Maximize Medicaid funding to support school-based behavioral health services, including payment for non-IEP related services.

Current Activities

- Preschool mental health consultation services in partnership with University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB)
- Partnerships with preschool programming (e.g., Lourie Center, PACT)
- Partnership with UMB on Center for School Mental Health
- MDH School Based Health Center (SBHC) development of enhanced service standards



Envisioned Phased Implementation Strategy

Phase One

FFS Reimbursement of LEAs/Other Provider Types



Phase Two

Phase One, Plus Administrative Claiming

- Adopting a phased approach will allow additional planning time to develop methodology and compliance processes for administrative claiming
- Permitting Fee-for-Service (FFS) billing in the interim will allow local education agencies (LEAs)/schools to benefit in near term prior to implementation of reimbursement for administrative costs



Next Steps

- Federal Authorities: Timing and submission of CMS authorities and CMS review of cost report templates, etc.
 - All will be subject to public comment period as Medicaid updates its state plan to include this expansion
- State Implementation
 - Phase I January 2025: Development of regulations and guidance; reimbursement and billing model, provider enrollment requirements
 - Phase II TBD: Secure technical assistance contractor for Phase II
