


#### Trend in Asian/Pacific Islander percentage of Maryland Population, 2001 to 2006

In the five years between 2001 and 2006 the overall Maryland population increased by 4.3%, while the Maryland Asian/Pacific Islander population increased by 25.1%.




Asians and Pacific Islanders in Maryland are almost twice as likely to be without health insurance




Asians and Pacific Islanders have higher rates of new cases of End-Stage Renal Disease than do Whites at ages of 65 and older




Asians and Pacific Islanders in Maryland are more likely than Whites to have been diagnosed with diabetes at ages 18-44




Asians and Pacific Islanders in Maryland are more likely than Whites to have been diagnosed with diabetes at ages 45-64




Asians and Pacific Islanders in Maryland are more likely than Whites to have been diagnosed with diabetes at ages 65 +
