### Medicaid Dental Care Access

- Medicaid funding for children and pregnant women has increased in recent years
  - Medicaid delivered oral health services to ~394,000 adults and children in 2013
  - Increased utilization due to improved outreach activities and increased participating providers

### Dental Fee Increase

- FY 2015 budget includes \$2.2 million (total funds) to increase Medicaid dental fees
- Increase will go into effect as of January 1, 2015
- Department worked with a group of providers to determine the codes to target for an increase



### Dental Facility Fee for Ambulatory Surgical Centers

- Medicaid expects to soon begin paying facility fees for dental services provided in ambulatory surgical centers
- Pending approval of regulations






### Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas


- The Health Resources Services Administration has designated areas of the Eastern Shore, Western Maryland, Southern Maryland and Baltimore City as having shortages
- Through direct clinical, school-based or linked, local health department and FQHC arrangements, all Maryland jurisdictions now have access to low-cost dental services





### Utilization: Children

- Mandated under EPSDT requirements for children under 21
- The percentage of children utilizing dental services has increased by almost 14 percentage points (68.3%) since CY 2008












### Utilization: Pregnant Women


- Maryland Senate Bill 590 (1998) required HealthChoice to cover dental services for pregnant women
- The percentage of pregnant women receiving a dental service in 2013 decreased from 30.7% to 28.1%
- The Department is investigating if changes in prenatal care have contributed to this decrease





### Utilization: Non-Pregnant Adults


- Adult dental services are not included in the capitation rates for either the MCOs or the dental ASO
- As of August 2014, all HealthChoice MCOs provide limited dental services to this population
- Benefits vary by MCO and include a combination of semi-annual oral exams and cleanings; x-rays; fillings and extractions






## Innovating to Improve Access to Dental Care

- Dental Home program
  - Acute care and preventive services
  - Comprehensive assessment for oral diseases and conditions
  - Individualized preventive dental health program
  - Guidance on growth and development
  - Instruction on proper tooth care and diet
  - Referrals to dental specialists, if needed
- Implemented statewide in December 2013 for children under 21 and REM participants over 21

- Continued efforts to increase the number of dental service providers
- · Dental fee increase
- Approval of facility fee for dental services provided in ambulatory surgical centers
- Focus on Health Professional Shortage Areas
- Dental Home program
