

## HB 1092 Workgroup

The Workgroup shall develop a Behavioral Health Crisis Grant Program that shall award competitive grants to local behavioral health authorities to establish and expand behavioral health crisis response programs and services that:

- 1) serve local behavioral health needs for children, adults, and older adults;
- 2) meet national standards;
- 3) integrate the delivery of mental health and substance use treatment; and
- 4) connect individuals to appropriate community–based care in a timely manner upon discharge.

#### HB 1092 Overview

### Workgroup Goals\_\_\_\_

- 1) Identify jurisdictions and services that reaches underserved populations
- 2) Identify potential barriers that would hamper individuals in crisis from receiving services
- 3) Identify the range of services that would be covered under the recommended funding changes
- 4) Identify and recommend specific criteria for the reimbursement of identified services within the Medicaid system
- 5) Recommend client and system outcomes to be tracked and monitored on a regular basis



# **Progress to Date**

- The Request for Proposals was issued on April 1 to the Local Health Authorities, Local Health Departments and providers.
- A subcommittee has been established to review proposals.
- \$3 million is available for FY 2020; \$4 million for FY 2021; and \$5 million for FY 2022.

#### **State Opioid Response (SOR) Updates**

- In September 2018, Maryland awarded a \$33 million (annually for two years) State Opioid Response (SOR) grant from SAMHSA.
- In February 2018, BHA submitted SOR Year 2 Continuation application for \$33 million to continue SOR Year 1 activities
- March 29, 2019, BHA applied for an additional \$17 million in SOR supplemental funding for SOR Year 1. Decision pending at this time.



#### SOR Updates State Opioid Response (SOR) Updates (Cont'd)

Supplemental funding was requested to support the following activities:

- Crisis walk-in, stabilization, and residential crisis bed expansion
- Minority Outreach and Technical Assistance teams
- Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) within criminal justice re-entry
- Naloxone distribution, care coordination, outreach
- Public awareness activities
- Grants to non-profits and faith-based organizations
- Recovery Housing
- Workforce development
- Care Coordination grants
