

# Redetermination Data

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- MDH is publicly posting Medicaid Check-In 2023 data on a new, designated webpage: <https://health.maryland.gov/mmcp/Pages/MedicaidCheckIn-Data.aspx>
- **June 2023 Highlights:**
  - Total participants up for renewal with a June 30 coverage end date : 139,051
  - Total participants auto-renewed in Maryland Health Connection: 53.5%
  - Individuals who no longer qualify for Medicaid through Maryland Health Connection may qualify for coverage through a qualified health plan or Medicare.
- **On the horizon:** Data on churn to QHP and return to Medicaid coverage.
- **Notes:**
  - Participants may report changes to the system, e.g., birth of a child, increases in income due to a new job, at any time during the year. This figure reflects the total number of participants who needed to renew their coverage by June 30, 2023. Additional participants may have had their coverage extended due to reporting of a change. Disenrollment rates also reflect participants appropriately disenrolled from coverage due to reporting a change because they are no longer eligible for Medicaid coverage.
  - Maryland received special authority from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to allow automatic renewal of coverage for Medicaid participants who are eligible for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Maryland (SNAP), when their gross income as determined by SNAP is under the applicable MAGI-based income standard.
