Benefit Overview



Overview

- Effective July 1, 2023, Maryland Medicaid will provide reimbursement for eligible community violence prevention services as required by HB 1005/SB 350 – Community Violence Prevention Services (Chs. 504 and 505 of the 2022 Acts)¹
 - Maryland is the second state to apply for a Medicaid State Plan Amendment for this benefit
- "Community violence" means intentional acts of interpersonal violence (defined as the intentional use of physical force or power against another individual by an individual or a small group of individuals) committed in public areas by individuals who are not family members or intimate partners of the victim
 - 40% of violent injuries are paid by Medicaid nationally
 - Exposure to acts of violence increases the likelihood of perpetrating a violent act later in life



Covered Services

- Community violence prevention services are evidence-based, trauma-informed, support services for the purpose of promoting improved health outcomes, preventing further injury, and future violence
- <u>Covered services include</u>: Mentorship, conflict mediation, crisis intervention, referrals to certified or licensed health care professionals or social services providers, patient education, and screening services to victims of violence



Provider Eligibility

- Community violence prevention services are delivered at an institutional level by Violence Prevention Providers ("VP")
 - Entities must:

- Maintain an affiliation with an authorized hospital
- Obtain a *NEW* Type II Organizational (Practice Type 99 Other) National Provider Identifier (NPI) number under the 405300000X Taxonomy - Prevention Professional
- Provide documentation in ePREP application that employees are certified violence prevention professionals
- Contract with Maryland's HealthChoice MCO prior to submitting HealthChoice claims for HealthChoice participants
- Violence Prevention Professionals must complete MDH approved community violence prevention training - HAVI²
 - <u>Note</u>: Individual violence prevention professionals are not eligible to enroll as a "VP" provider type



Hospital Affiliation

- VPs must be affiliated with an authorized in-state or out-of-state hospital in order to qualify for reimbursement
- As determined by Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMMS), Maryland hospitals must have one of the following designations:
 - Primary Care Resource Center (PARC)
 - Level I Trauma Center;
 - Level II Trauma Center; or
 - Pediatric Trauma Center
- Hospitals not located in Maryland must have one of the following designations, as defined by the American College of Surgeons:
 - Level I Trauma Center;
 - Level II Trauma Center; or
 - Pediatric Trauma Center



Reimbursement Methodology

CPT Code* (modifier)	Description	Proposed Rate	Provider Type	Place of Service	Limitations
99402	Preventive medicine counseling: 30 minutes	\$32.76	VP	19 - Off-campus Outpatient Hospital 21 - Inpatient Hospital 22 - On Campus - Outpatient Hospital	A maximum of 8 units of service per day may be billed per patient.
99402 GT*	Preventive medicine counseling: 30 minutes (Delivered via telehealth)	\$32.76	VP		No more than 100 units of services may be billed on a 12-month rolling basis.

*This CPT code is not linked to a specific ICD. Note: 99402 will billed on the CMS 1500.



Potential Care Pathway

- Bob was exposed to an act of community violence
 - Admitted to level two trauma center
 - Hospital is enrolled as a violence prevention provider
 - During hospitalization, VP connects a violence prevention professional to speak with Bob
 - Bob accepts care and agrees to meet with the violence prevention professional over the next several weeks/months
- Violence prevention professional bills the service to the patient's HealthChoice MCO or FFS Medicaid
 - Violence prevention professional meets with Bob 5 more times in the next six months, then refers Bob to a licensed social worker
