Healthy Start Procedure Code Changes

Effective February 1, 2004, the Maryland Medical Assistance Program will change the Healthy Start procedure codes.

The Health Insurance Portability Accountability Act (HIPAA) requires providers to use nationally recognized procedure codes when billing for health care services. Currently, providers are using procedure codes established by Maryland Medical Assistance.

For dates of service on or after February 1, 2004, claims should be submitted with the procedure codes listed below. The fees for Healthy Start services will not change at this time.

IMPORTANT CHANGES

- For Healthy Start services rendered **prior to** February 1, 2004, bill using the current procedure codes (W1930, W1931, W1932, W1933, W1934, W1935, or W9097) **regardless of when the claims are submitted for payment**.
- For dates of service on or after February 1, 2004, Local Health Department will only use three national procedure codes to bill Medical Assistance for Healthy Start services. These national codes are:
 - o H1001 (Prenatal Care, At-Risk Enhanced Service; Ante Partum Management)
 - o H1002 (Prenatal Care At-Risk Enriched Service; Care Coordination)
 - o H1004 (Prenatal Care At-Risk enhanced service; follow-up home visit)

- ◆ The same codes are being used for Healthy Start case management for pregnant women and children. The national procedure code modifier "TH" will be used to differentiate pregnant women from children. You will be required to use a special modifier TH when billing for a Prenatal Service and the Postpartum Service.
- ◆ The same codes are being used for Healthy Start home-based and face-to-face visits. A place of service code must be used. For a clinic visit, use either the Place of Service code <u>71</u> or the Place of Service code <u>11</u>. For a home-based visit, use the Place of Service code <u>12</u>. In order to get the higher payment for a home-based visit, the place of service code must be <u>12</u>.
- ♦ Your reimbursement will be based on a combination of the Procedure Code, Modifier, and Place of Service Code.

Examples:

Example#1 – A Local Health Department submits a claim in March 2004 for Healthy Start Prenatal Ongoing Case Management rendered in November 2003. The Local Health Department will bill using only procedure code **W1932**.

Example#2 – A Local Health Department submits a claim in March 2004 for Healthy Start Prenatal Ongoing Case Management rendered in February 2003. The Local Health Department will bill using only procedure code **H1002** with modifier **TH** and Place of Service **71**.
