The Maryland Medical Assistance Program is proposing to amend Regulations .01, .03 — .05 and .07 under COMAR 10.09.53 Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT): Private Duty Nursing. A copy of the proposed amendments, as printed in the December 21, 2007 issue of the Maryland Register, is attached.

The proposed amendments are intended to eliminate the newborn early discharge assessment as a covered service under this regulation because it is now provided as a covered service under COMAR 10.09.04 Home Health Services. Additionally, the proposed changes delete all language requiring a nurse to sign his or her nursing license to coincide with the Board of Nursing's discontinuation of issuing a hard copy license.

Notice of Proposed Action

The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene proposes to amend Regulations .01, .03—.05, and .07 under COMAR 10.09.53 Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment: Private Duty Nursing.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this action is to delete all language requiring the nurse to sign his or her license to coincide with the Board of Nursing's discontinuation of issuing a hard copy license. Nursing licenses are now verified electronically. Additionally, the Department proposes to eliminate the newborn early discharge assessment as a covered service under this chapter since it is now provided as a covered service under COMAR 10.09.04 Home Health Services.

Comparison to Federal Standards

There is no corresponding federal standard to this proposed action.

Estimate of Economic Impact

The proposed action has no economic impact.

Economic Impact on Small Businesses

The proposed action has minimal or no economic impact on small businesses.

.03 Conditions for Participation.

Requirements for participation in private duty nursing services are that a provider shall:

- D. Ensure that each nurse rendering services to a participant:
- (1) Has a valid [signed], unrestricted nursing license to provide nursing services in the jurisdiction in which services are rendered;
 - (2)—(11) (text unchanged)
 - E.—F. (text unchanged)
 - G. Maintain a personnel folder at the agency's business office for each nurse which shall include the following:
 - (1) A copy of the nurse's [signed] verified, current license;
 - (2)—(5) (text unchanged)
 - H.—O. (text unchanged)

.04 Covered Services.

A.—C. (text unchanged)

- [D. The Program covers a provider's newborn early discharge assessment visit to a participant, when the assessment:
 - (1) Is 4 hours or less;
 - (2) Is ordered by a physician, certified nurse midwife, or nurse practitioner;
 - (3) Is delivered to a participant and a participant's mother who have been discharged within 48 hours after delivery;
 - (4) Occurs within 36 hours after discharge;
 - (5) Includes:
- (a) An evaluation of the presence of immediate problems of dehydration, sepsis, infection, jaundice, respiratory distress, cardiac distress, or other adverse physical symptoms of the infant;
- (b) An evaluation of the presence of immediate problems of dehydration, sepsis, infection, bleeding, pain, or other adverse physical symptoms of the mother;
 - (c) Collection of a blood specimen for newborn screening as described in COMAR 10.52.12.02;
- (d) An evaluation of risk factors that identify biological factors for the infant, maternal health behaviors, psychosocial environmental problems, or any other concerns or problems perceived by the private duty nurse that are identified on a form specified by the Department; and
- (e) Referrals for any continuing health care services, including services for postpartum women and children under COMAR 10.09.38.04, skilled nursing services under this regulation, or home health under COMAR 10.09.04.04; and
 - (6) Is conducted by a registered nurse.]

.05 Limitations.

- A. Under this chapter, the Program does not cover the following:
 - (1)—(12) (text unchanged)
 - [(13) Newborn early discharge services provided more than one time to a recipient;]
 - [(14)] (13)—[(17)] (16) (text unchanged)
- [(18)] (17) Services provided by a nurse who does not possess a valid, current, [signed,] unrestricted nursing license to provide nursing services in the jurisdiction in which services are rendered;
 - [(19)] (18)—[(23)] (22) (text unchanged)
 - B. (text unchanged)
- [C. A provider may not bill for a newborn early discharge assessment visit provided on the same day as services billed under COMAR 10.09.38, or as other services billed under this chapter.]

.07 Payment Procedures.
