Subject: Coverage of Hospice and Treatment Services for Children

This transmittal is to clarify Section 2302 of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) regarding concurrent care for children which removes the prohibition on children receiving curative treatment upon the election of the hospice benefit. This provision was effective upon enactment of the ACA on March 23, 2010. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) released a State Medicaid Director letter in September providing additional guidance. The full text of the letter may be found at:

Hospice services are a covered benefit for all children under the Maryland Medicaid program. All medically necessary hospice services are included for qualified recipients when a physician has certified that the recipient is within the last six months of life. The change made by the ACA provides that hospice services must be made available to Medicaid children without forgoing any other services to which the recipient is entitled for the treatment of the terminal condition.

All Medicaid managed care organizations (MCOs) and hospice providers must ensure that all appropriate staff within their organization are trained on this requirement. For recipients in the fee-for-service program, Medicaid's claims system is capable of accepting claims for curative services provided to children. MCOs must ensure their claims systems are appropriately configured to process claims resulting from this change.
