Re: Oral Nutritional Supplements and Supplemental Vitamins EPSDT and REM

Coverage Limitations

The purpose of this transmittal is to clarify the Department's policies regarding the general limitation on coverage for oral nutritional supplements and supplemental vitamins and to inform Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) and providers that medically necessary oral nutritional supplements and supplemental vitamins are covered for children under 21 years of age as an Expanded EPSDT Service and for REM clients 21 years old or older as a REM Optional Service. Regulations generally restrict coverage for oral nutritional supplements and supplemental vitamins. However, when medically necessary, orally administered nutritional supplements and supplemental vitamins are covered as an EPSDT Service (COMAR 10.09.26.06), an Expanded EPSDT Service (COMAR 10.09.37.04) or a REM Optional Service (COMAR 10.09.69.10). In such cases, nutritional supplements and vitamins, whether taken orally or otherwise, after providing proof of medical necessity, are covered by Maryland Medicaid under the Pharmacy Services Program and therefore must also be covered by MCOs.
