## **Useful Medicare Phone Numbers for Pharmacies**

In the event recipients know they are enrolled in a Part D plan, but do not have documentation with them, the pharmacy may call **1-866-835-7595** to identify the appropriate plan.

A pharmacy may use the E1 query point-of-sale system to determine which plan a recipient is enrolled in. If the pharmacy is having problems with the system, they may call **1-800-388-2316** for technical assistance.

To start the enrollment process or identify a recipient 's plan call 1-800-662-0210.

## **Maryland Pharmacy Program Wrap-Around Coverage**

Since Part D Medicare excludes certain classes of drugs in basic plans, the Maryland Medicaid Pharmacy Program will continue to cover drugs in those classes to the extent the Program historically covered them for the dual eligible recipients. The **Preferred Drug List** and **Brand Medically Necessary** restrictions will apply. The following table lists the classes that the State will cover for individuals who have both a Medicare Card and the Red and White Medicaid Card.

## Maryland Medicaid Coverage of Drug Classes Excluded from Medicare Part D Basic Plans (For Dual Eligibles Only)

Classes of Drugs Excluded by Medicare Part D Basic Prescription Drug Plans	Maryland Coverage for Dual Eligibles (Medicare card & Red and White Medicaid Card)
Drugs when used for anorexia, weight loss, weight gain	Products that are not central nervous system stimulants (e.g. Xenical)
Drugs when used for the symptomatic relief of cough and colds	Legend products only
Prescription vitamins and mineral products	All
Nonprescription drugs (Over-the-Counter)	Few (e.g., Ferrous sulfate, enteric coated aspirin, ergocalciferol liquid)
Barbiturates (drugs used before surgery to relieve anxiety or tension, to help control seizures in certain disorders or diseases, sometimes used to relieve nervousness or restlessness during the daytime)	All
Benzodiazepines (drugs used to relieve anxiety, treat insomnia (trouble in sleeping), or help relax muscles or relieve muscle spasms)	All
