

MARYLAND MEDICAID PHARMACY PROGRAM

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In an effort to give timely notice to the pharmacy community concerning important pharmacy topics, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's (DHMH) **Maryland Pharmacy Program** (MPP) has developed the **Maryland Pharmacy Program Advisory**. SAMPLE PAIN MANAGEMENT AGREEMENTS

One of the concerns of the Maryland Medicaid Pharmacy Program is the inappropriate use of controlled substances. The Corrective Managed Care (CMC) program was established to address this concern. The CMC reviews drug claims data monthly for potential misuse of controlled drugs among recipients. This review screens for fee-for-service recipients who have obtained duplicate drug therapy, have sought out multiple prescribers for similar medications, and/or have patronized multiple pharmacies. The CMC program has the ability to restrict, or lock-in fee-for-service recipients to one pharmacy if there is evidence suggesting drug misuse that cannot otherwise be managed.

Because the CMC program makes ongoing efforts to deter drug misuse, it is offering sample pain management agreements on the Maryland Medicaid Pharmacy website at http://www.dhmh.state.md.us/mma/mpap/painmanagement.htm. These agreements facilitate communication between prescribers and patients about the expectations of a pain treatment drug regimen. The CMC does not endorse any specific agreement, nor is it a requirement of the Maryland Medicaid Pharmacy Program.
