Brands Lidoderm® and Depakote® Sprinkle Capsules Removal from DAW 6 Program

The Maryland Medicaid Pharmacy Program (MMPP) wants to alert you that effective Monday, March 21, 2016 brands Lidoderm® (lidocaine patch 5%) and Depakote® Sprinkle Capsules (divalproex sodium delayed release capsules) are no longer preferred over their generic equivalents. Claims for lidocaine patch 5% and divalproex sodium delayed release capsules will be handled in the same manner as claims for other multisource drugs. Fee-for-service Medicaid claims for brands Lidoderm® and Depakote® Sprinkle Capsules will adjudicate only if there is prior authorization based on an approved Medwatch form which can be found at the following link: https://mmcp.dhmh.maryland.gov/pap/docs/Maryland%20Medwatch%20Form.pdf
