## **Testing for COVID-19 by Medicaid Pharmacies**

On May 28, 2020, the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) released guidance related to testing for COVID-19 by Maryland Medicaid Pharmacies (see <u>Testing for COVID-19 by Medicaid</u> <u>Pharmacies</u>).

The Fee-For-Service (FFS) Point of Sale Electronic (POS) Claims Processing vendor, Conduent State Healthcare, is currently working on the necessary system modifications to allow pharmacies to submit claims for specimen collection for COVID-19 testing through the POS claim processing system. Starting June 4, 2020, the claims processing system will be ready to process these claims. Pharmacies will be able to bill for dates of service retrospective to May 29, 2020.

The Payer Specific instructions on how to submit a claim for the collection of the specimen are available at <u>http://mdrxprograms.com/ooep.html#PSI</u>. In order for the system to pay correctly, you must follow the instructions related to the pricing segment; specifically you must enter <u>\$23.12</u> in both field 426-DQ (Usual and Customary Charge) and field 43Ø-DU (Gross Amount Due).
