

## Maryland Medical Assistance Maintenance Drugs

- A maintenance drug means a drug anticipated that is to be required for 6 months or more to treat a chronic condition.
- The initial prescription for a maintenance drug is limited to a 34-day supply.
- On subsequent prescriptions a maximum supply of 100 days is allowed for drugs in the following American Hospital Formulary Service (AHFS) classes<sup>1</sup>:

**Certain drugs may have specific quantity limits, which supersede this list. See the Prior Authorization forms for quantity limits.**
