BOARD OF PHARMACY

ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION  
AND REINSTATING PHARMACY LICENSE

By Order dated April 6, 1981 (the "1981 Order"), the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") found John C. Andreadakis, P.D. (the "Respondent") guilty of violating Article 43, § 266A(C)(i) and (ii) of the Annotated Code of Maryland. The Board revoked Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in Maryland, immediately stayed that revocation, and placed him on probation subject to certain conditions (the "Conditions of Probation").

On April 7, 1984, Respondent petitioned the Board for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in Maryland without any conditions or restrictions. At its meeting on April 18, 1984, the Board reviewed Respondent's petition for reinstatement. Based upon its review of the petition and the monthly probation reports prepared by the Board member designated to monitor Respondent's compliance with his Conditions of Probation, the Board determined that Respondent had satisfactorily fulfilled all of the Conditions of Probation contained in the 1981 Order.

FINDING OF FACT

The Board finds that Respondent has satisfactorily complied with all of the Conditions of Probation imposed by the Board's 1981 Order.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The Board concludes as a matter of law that it is appropriate to terminate Respondent's Conditions of Probation and to reinstate his license to practice pharmacy without any condition or restriction whatsoever.

ORDER

Upon the foregoing Finding of Fact and Conclusion of Law, it is this 7th <sup>May</sup> day of April, 1984 by an unanimous vote of a quorum of the Board

ORDERED that effective as of April 6, 1984, the Conditions of Probation imposed upon Respondent's practice of pharmacy by the Board's 1981 Order are hereby TERMINATED and of no further force and effect; and be it further

ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Maryland is hereby REINSTATED without any condition or restriction whatsoever.
