**ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION**

Pursuant to Md. Code Ann., State Gov't §§ 10-226(c)(2) (2021 Repl. Vol.) and Md. Code Regs. ("COMAR") 10.34.01.12, the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") hereby summarily suspends the license of **David Bourgeois, License Number 24609** (the "Respondent"), to practice as a pharmacist, under the Maryland Pharmacy Act (the "Act"), Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 12-101 *et seq.* (2021 Repl. Vol.). This Order is based on the following investigative findings, which the Board has reason to believe are true:

**INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS<sup>1</sup>**

1. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was registered to practice as a pharmacist in the State of Maryland. The Respondent originally was licensed to practice as a pharmacist in Maryland on or about November 1, 2016. The Respondent's license expires on June 30, 2024.

2. On or about July 20, 2021, the Respondent self-referred to Pharmacy Rehabilitation Services (“PRS”). PRS assists pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and their families who may be experiencing personal problems.

3. After his self-referral, the Respondent was evaluated and monitored by PRS staff.

4. Following his self-referral, PRS staff determined that the Respondent was non-compliant with PRS treatment recommendations, and deemed the Respondent “not safe to work” as a pharmacist.

5. PRS notified the Board of its concerns regarding the Respondent’s non-compliance and being unsafe to work as a pharmacist. After being notified of these concerns, the Board opened an investigation of the Respondent and determined that the Respondent’s pharmacy practice is a risk to public health, safety, and welfare.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing investigative findings, the Board concludes as a matter of law that the public health, safety, and welfare imperatively require emergency action in this case, pursuant to State Gov’t § 10-226(c)(2) and COMAR 10.34.01.12.

### ORDER

Based on the foregoing Investigative Findings and Conclusions of Law, it is this 9<sup>th</sup> day of August 2022, by a majority of the quorum of the Board, hereby

**ORDERED** that pursuant to the authority vested in the Board by Md. Code Ann., State Gov’t § 10-226(c)(2), the Respondent’s license to practice as a pharmacist in the

State of Maryland under license number **24609** is hereby **SUMMARILY SUSPENDED**;  
and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Respondent is prohibited from practicing as a pharmacist in  
the State of Maryland; and it is further


**ORDERED** that the Respondent shall immediately return all licenses to the  
Board; and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Respondent has the opportunity to appear before the Board  
for a post-deprivation show cause hearing. A request for a post-deprivation show cause  
hearing must be in writing and be made **WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that if the Respondent fails to request a post-deprivation show cause  
hearing, or if the Respondent requests a post-deprivation show cause hearing but fails to  
appear when scheduled, the Respondent's license will remain **SUMMARILY  
SUSPENDED**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this **ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION** is a **PUBLIC  
DOCUMENT** pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. §§ 4-101 *et seq.* (2022).
