ORDER LIFTING SUSPENSION

Background

The Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") is in receipt of a petition from Moslem Eskandari, License No. 14714, requesting to lift the suspension of his license as set forth in a Final Decision and Order, dated April 18, 2001. The Order provides that Mr. Eskandari may petition to lift the suspension after successful completion of a Board-approved ethics course and has been compliant with the submission of self-reports. Mr. Eskandari submitted evidence of his successful completion of a Board-approved ethics course in December 2011. Mr. Eskandari currently resides in Georgia and practices in Virginia. On February 15, 2012, the Board voted to lift the suspension and place Mr. Eskandari's license on immediate probation with terms as set forth below.

ORDER

Based on agreement of the parties, it is this 9TH day of MARCH, 2012, by an affirmative vote of the Board, hereby

ORDERED that the suspension of Mr. Eskandari's license is LIFTED; and be it further,

ORDERED that Mr. Eskandari's license be placed on immediate PROBATION for TWO YEARS (2) YEARS; and be it further,

ORDERED that during the probationary period, Mr. Eskandari:

- (1) May not own a pharmacy, in whole or in part, or work for a pharmacy that is owned

in whole or in part by a family member; and

(2) Shall notify the Board immediately in writing if he moves back to Maryland or practices pharmacy in Maryland; and be it further,

ORDERED that after two years of probation, Mr. Eskandari may petition to terminate the probation provided that he has fully complied with the probationary terms and has no pending complaints against him; and be it further,

ORDERED that Mr. Eskandari shall at all times cooperate with the Board in the monitoring, supervision, and investigation of his compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that Mr. Eskandari's failure to fully cooperate with the Board shall be deemed a violation of the terms of probation and a violation of this Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that in the event the Board finds for any good faith reason that Mr. Eskandari has violated any of the terms of this Order, or in the event that the Board finds for any good faith reason that Mr. Eskandari has committed a violation of Title 12 of the Health Occupations Article or regulations adopted thereunder, the Board may take further disciplinary action against Mr. Eskandari, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing; and be it further,

ORDERED that Mr. Eskandari shall bear the expenses associated with this Order; and be it further,

ORDERED that this document constitutes a formal disciplinary action of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and is therefore a public document for purposes of public disclosure, pursuant to the Public Information Act., State Gov't § 10-611 *et seq.*
