**CONSENT ORDER FOR INITIAL REGISTRATION**

**BACKGROUND**

On or about November 22, 2022, Lisa Michelle Jones applied to the Maryland State Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) for registration as a pharmacy technician. On her application, Ms. Jones answered “yes” to a personal attestation question regarding having a criminal history. Ms. Jones also submitted to a Maryland Criminal Justice Information System (“CJIS”) background check in accordance with Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-02(c).

In lieu of instituting formal proceedings against Ms. Jones’ application, in accordance with the Maryland Pharmacy Act, Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. § 12-6B-01 *et seq.*, the Board offered Ms. Jones the opportunity to resolve this matter by agreeing to the terms set forth in this Consent Order.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On or about November 22, 2022, Ms. Jones applied to the Board for registration as a pharmacy technician.
2. On her application, Ms. Jones answered “yes” to the question “Have you committed a criminal act for which you pled guilty or nolo contendere, or for which you were convicted or received probation before judgment?” Ms. Jones did not provide any

additional information related to her “yes” answer.

3. Upon the Board’s request for further information, Ms. Jones stated that she paid a fine for petty larceny, a misdemeanor. Ms. Jones also provided a summons and receipt for payment of the fine related to the matter.
4. Upon the Board’s request for even further information explaining the incident, Ms. Jones stated that she was using a self-checkout line in a store and accidentally tried to leave without scanning some items. She received a criminal citation and was ordered to pay the fine after a court appearance.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that Ms. Jones is subject to discipline pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 12-6B-02(b)(1) & 12-6B-09(22).

### **ORDER**

Based on an affirmative vote of the Board, it is this 9<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2023, hereby:

**ORDERED** that Ms. Jones be GRANTED a pharmacy technician registration; and be it further,


**ORDERED** that upon the first renewal of her pharmacy technician registration, Ms. Jones shall submit to a State criminal history records check; and be it further,

**ORDERED** that in the event Ms. Jones’ criminal history records check indicates further criminal activity, the Board may impose further disciplinary action against Ms. Jones’ registration, including suspension or revocation, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing; and be it further,

**ORDERED** that Ms. Jones shall be responsible for all costs associated with this Consent Order; and be it further,

**ORDERED** that this is a formal order of the Maryland Board of Pharmacy and as such is a public document pursuant to the Md. Code Ann., Gen. Provisions § 4-333(b).
