Data Limitation

Historically, it has been difficult to present data by gender identity. No reliable system exists for collecting or reporting gender identity and some agencies do not collect or have complete data on gender identity. This presentation is likely underreporting the number of gender diverse people living with diagnosed HIV because of challenges in accurately identifying and reporting gender identity in HIV surveillance.

Two-thirds of the new HIV diagnoses were linked to care within 1 month





Race/Ethnicity



Gender Diverse People Living with Diagnosed HIV in Maryland: 359




Data have been statistically adjusted to account for missing transmission category. Interruptions in access to services due to the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a dramatic decline in HIV testing, diagnoses, and routine care in 2020. Caution should be exercised when examining newly reported diagnoses and interpreting trends.

Summary



New diagnoses were more common among transwomen and younger age groups (20-29)



Younger age groups (20-29) were less likely to be retained in HIV care and virally suppressed than older age groups



Compared to all people in Maryland with diagnosed HIV, gender diverse people were more likely to be in HIV care but less likely to be virally suppressed in 2020
