


HIV AMONG WHITE PEOPLE IN MARYLAND, 2022

New HIV Diagnoses in Maryland

In 2022, there were 69 reported HIV diagnoses among NH-White people.

- In 2022, NH-White people accounted for 9.2% of the 751 reported HIV diagnoses.
- It is estimated that an additional 9.7% of NH-White people living with HIV in Maryland remain undiagnosed, as of 2021.



Characteristics of White People Living with HIV in Maryland

At the end of 2022, there were 3,762 NH-White people living with diagnosed HIV.

- 1 in 693 NH-White persons were reported to be living with diagnosed HIV in 2022.
- Rates (per 100,000) of HIV were over four times higher among NH-White males (237.6) as compared to NH-White females (54.6).
- Of the 3,762 NH-White persons living with diagnosed HIV, 73.7% had a viral load test result reported in 2022. Of those with a reported test result, 92.4% had a suppressed viral load.
