





In 2017, youth and young adults (ages 15-24) accounted for 68% of new Chlamydia cases and 43% of new Gonorrhea cases.



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


TEEN STI COMMUNICATION PLAN

I WANT THE KIT (IWTK)

The Howard County Health Department (HCHD), in partnership with HCPSS and the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) developed the IWTK awareness campaign to inform high school students about the risks of STIs; and offer free, confidential screening tests and access to treatment, as well as condom availability and education in all Howard County high schools.

CONDOM AVAILABILITY & EDUCATION PROGRAM (CAEP) IN SCHOOLS

The Howard County Health Department (HCHD), in partnership with HCPSS and the Maryland Department of Health (MDH), began providing sexually transmitted infection (STI) prevention education and condom availability and education in high schools in January 2019. This program encourages condom use among sexually active HCPSS high school students to help reduce the number of STIs.






CONDOM AVAILABILITY & EDUCATION PROGRAM TIMELINE

- January 2019 program began with 15 bags of condoms per high school
- February 2019 reduced number of condoms per bag from 10-6
- Since 1/22/2019 700 bags of condoms have been distributed to schools
- Approximately 6600 condoms have been distributed




PRELIMINARY DATA FROM IWTK PILOT






ORDERED KITS: GENDER








RETURNED KITS: GENDER








ORDERED KITS: AGE








RETURNED KITS: AGE








ORDERED KITS: RACE
