Who Was David Glasser?

(1933-1989)





Dr. David Glasser, MD, MPH

Problem-solver and visionary;

- Used money smuggled to him in hollowed out books while serving in U.S. Army Medical Corps to help restore a TB treatment hospital.
- Initiated local ordinances as Director, Bureau of Disease Control, Baltimore City, including pharmacy reporting of TB medications.
- Championed needle-exchange programs to stop the spread of HIV.
- Created a program of utilizing nurse case managers in City TB program to provide individualized and carefully monitored TB care.
- Partnered with universities and hospitals to promote public health research and better clinical practice.

Dr. David Glasser

• 1966: Baltimore City TB case rate of 75/100,000 was the highest case rate of any large U.S. city. As a consequence, Maryland also ranked #1

for TB in the country.

• 1973: Initiated 4-drug treatment.

• 1979: Implemented DOT.

• 1981: City TB case rate 35.6/100,000


• 2005: City TB case rate 10.6/100,000

• 2017: City TB case rate 4.1/100,000

Who Was David Glasser?



Not a world famous man, but a man who dreamed big, worked hard to achieve, was not afraid to do things that many considered "undoable" and a true public health advocate who laid the ground work for fundamental change in TB case management, prevention and control in all of Maryland.



Where Did the Design of the Award Come From?



International Congress on Tuberculosis September 21, 1908

• Held in Washington, D.C. at the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History.

• Largest worldwide exposition on TB at a time when the impact of TB worldwide was measured in terms of *mortality*.

• First time the meeting was held in US; attendance from all 47 states and many foreign countries.

1908 International Congress on Tuberculosis Maryland Awards

Silver Medal to the state of Maryland for its exhibit of laws and ordinances in force to prevent TB; the awarding document signed by President Theodore Roosevelt.

Gold Medal to State Board of Health for the best example of an individualized package of preventive supplies for a tuberculosis


