# Maryland High School Survey - Baltimore City Sample Description 

## Sample Description

School Level - All schools of the following type(s) containing grades 9, 10, 11, or 12 were included in the sampling frame:

| School Type |  |

| Special education | Excluded |

Note: Your 2014 YRBS sampling frame had the same types of schools included and excluded.
A total of 26 schools were selected systematically with probability proportional to enrollment in grades 9 through 12 using a random start. 1 school was ineligible.

Class Level - All classes in a required subject or all classes meeting during a particular period of the day, depending on the school, were included in the sampling frame. Systematic equal probability sampling with a random start was used to select classes from each school that participated in the survey.

## Response Rates

Schools - $\quad 100 \% 25$ of the 25 sampled eligible schools participated.

Overall response rate - $\quad 100 \% * 56 \%=56 \%^{1}$

## Weighting

In probability sampling, associating a weight with each questionnaire is intended to reflect the likelihood of sampling each student and to reduce bias by compensating for differing patterns of nonresponse. The low overall response rate precludes weighting of the data.

## Use of the Weighted Results

The unweighted results provide a description of the priority health-risk behaviors of the survey participants. These results cannot be generalized to other students.
