## 1. Open Legislative Council Meeting

Ms. Kiel called the Legislative Council meeting to order at 10:00 AM, held roll call and reviewed the agenda. Updates to both SB 952 (HB 1359) and SB 623 (HB 1360) were added to the agenda. Since the 2020 General Assembly is ending session on March 18, 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all remaining scheduled weekly legislative calls are canceled.

## 2. Approve Minutes

Dr. Gerstenblith motioned to approve the February 25 minutes and Ms. Kramer seconded the motion. Ms. Backley motioned to approve the March 10 minutes and Dr. Gerstenblith seconded the motion. There will be an online vote for minutes.

## 3. Discuss HB 3 - Business Regulation - Flavored Tobacco Products -- Prohibitions

Dawn Berkowitz, Director, MDH Center for Tobacco Prevention and Control discussed the amendments to the **HB 3 3<sup>rd</sup> Reader**. One amendment in the 3<sup>rd</sup> reader creates a definition for a "Smoking Bar," which creates confusion, increases the risk of exposure to secondhand smoke, and is in contrast with the Clean Indoor Air Act. Another amendment would exempt

open (refillable) electronic smoking devices from the flavor ban. The council discussed these amendments and whether to put forth a Letter of Information for the 3<sup>rd</sup> reader.

A decision was made on the call for all members to vote online on the Council's submission of the Letter of Information for HB 3. Twenty-three members voted; 17 members voted to approve the Council's submission of the Letter of Information; and 6 members abstained from voting.

Draft letters of support were written for both SB 952 (HB 1359) and SB 623 (HB 1360), however because of the early General Assembly closure, these will be held until the possibility of a special session later in the year.
