Maryland's Medicaid Program

Overview (Fiscal Year 2018)

Fiscal Impact

- Approximately \$11 billion in state and federal funds
- Typically accounts for about 23% of State budget

Reach

- Provides benefits for approximately 1.39 million people
- 1.18 million (85.1%) are enrolled in HealthChoice



Background on Medicaid and HealthChoice

Maryland's Eligibility Requirements

Be a resident of Maryland

Be a U.S. Citizen or non-citizen who meets immigration status requirements

- Individuals who are not legally in the United States and most applicants who have not met the five year bar are not eligible for full Medicaid benefits
- Individuals may be eligible for Medicaid coverage of emergency medical services, including labor and delivery services
- To qualify for emergency medical services, the applicant must meet all other Medicaid eligibility criteria, including income limits



Background on Medicaid and HealthChoice Maryland's Eligibility Requirements

Provide a Social Security Number (SSN)

Meet financial requirements

- Medicaid income limits and rules vary for different groups of individuals and household sizes
- Income limits for children, parents and caretaker relatives, adults ages 19-64, and pregnant women



Background on Medicaid and HealthChoice Eligibility for Pregnant Women and Infants

Pregnant women up to 264% Federal Poverty Level

Eligibility continues for 60 days postpartum and then if no longer eligible for full Medicaid, will be automatically enrolled in Family Planning Program

Newborns of eligible mothers are automatically enrolled in Medicaid for 1-year

Pregnant women are also eligible for dental benefits while pregnant and up to 60 days postpartum

Enrolling in Medicaid

Participants may enroll in Medicaid, then select an MCO, and pick their primary care provider (PCP) by:

- Visiting <u>https://www.marylandhealthconnection.gov/</u> and logging into your account
- Downloading Maryland Health Connection's free mobile app, Enroll MHC
- Calling Maryland Health Connection at 1-855-642-8572 (TTY: 1-855-642-8573)
- By visiting a health department, or department of social services

Federally Mandated Services

Hospital care (inpatient and outpatient)

Nursing home care

Physician services

Laboratory and x-ray services

Immunizations and other early and periodic screening, diagnosis & treatment (EPSDT) services

Family planning services and supplies

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and rural health clinic services

Nurse midwife and nurse practitioner services



Maryland's Medicaid Program

Select Optional Services Covered*

Prescription drugs

Dental Services for pregnant women and children (Healthy Smiles)

Rehabilitation and other therapies

Clinic services

Durable medical equipment and supplies

Mental health and substance use disorder treatment services

*Services offered in additional to federally mandated services

11 Note: All medically necessary services are mandatory for children through EPSDT



Background on Medicaid and HealthChoice

Non-Emergent Medical Transportation

Non-Emergency Transportation (NEMT) is available for recipients who have no other means of getting to their medical appointments

- Provided by the local jurisdictions
- Must be scheduled a minimum of 24 hours in advance, with the exception of hospital discharges
- Only provides transport for those who have no other means of getting to their appointments

§1115 Demonstration Waiver & New Initiatives §1115 HealthChoice Waiver

The Federal Government through §1115 demonstration waivers :

• Allows states to have flexibility in their Medicaid Programs

The waiver permits Maryland to implement certain programs including:

- Managed Care
- MCH Home Visiting Expansion



Maryland's Medicaid Overview

HealthChoice

HealthChoice is the name of the Maryland's statewide mandatory managed care program

The HealthChoice Program:

- Provides health care to most Medicaid participants
- Requires eligible Medicaid participants enroll in a Managed Care Organization (MCO) of their choice and select a primary care provider (PCP) to oversee their medical care
- Provides services to Medicaid recipients in Maryland
- Contracts with of providers (doctors, hospitals) to provide covered services to their enrollees
- Is responsible to provide or arrange for the full range of health care services

HealthChoice Program

Managed Care Organizations

Responsible for providing other services related to the patient's healthcare, including:

- Language interpretation
- Educating enrollees on prevention and good health habits
- Providing case management, outreach and home visits for certain special needs and hard-to-reach populations
- Coordinates needed services such as transportation and the Supplemental Nutritional Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
- Certain services are carved out of the MCO benefit package



HealthChoice Program

Value-Added Services

MCOs may offer additional services, <u>not</u> in the standard Medicaid benefit package, to its enrollees

- MCOs do <u>not</u> get reimbursed by Medicaid for these services
- All of the MCOs have chosen to offer preventive dental services for adults, a service not normally covered under Maryland Medicaid
- Only those enrolled in HealthChoice may receive these services



HealthChoice Program Pregnant & Postpartum Women

Below are examples for serving pregnant and postpartum women as set forth in the regulations

- Scheduling an appointment for the first prenatal visit and seeing the woman within 10 days of request
- Linking a pregnant woman with a pediatric provider before delivery
- Dental coverage
- Refer pregnant and postpartum women with a substance use disorder for substance use treatment within 24 hours of request
- Nutrition counseling by licensed nutritionists or dietitians
- Smoking cessation education and treatment

Maryland Medicaid's Home Visiting Services (HVS) Pilot

Overview

Evidence-based home visiting services for high-risk pregnant women and children up to two (2) years old

Must be Medicaid beneficiaries to participate

Evidence-based programs that may be offered:

- Nurse Family Partnership
- Healthy Families America

HVS Pilots are funded separately and distinctly from federally funded home visiting programs (e.g. MIECHV)

Payment based on a per home visit rate



§1115 Demonstration Waiver & New Initiatives **Overview (cont.)**

Developed in response to local jurisdictions request for a funding path

Local health departments or other local government entities, such as a local management board, to serve as Lead Entities

There is no MDH funding contribution


To access federal funds Lead Entities must be able to fund non-federal share with local dollars

To improve health outcomes for targeted populations

To improve community integration for at-risk Medicaid beneficiaries



To reduce unnecessary/inappropriate utilization of emergency health services



Maryland Medicaid's Home Visiting Services (HVS) Pilot HVS Pilot Awardees

Harford County Health Department

- Round 1 awardee (2017)
- 30 beneficiaries
- Up to \$269,268 combined local and federal matching Medicaid funds
- Operating Healthy Families America (HFA)

Garrett County Health Department

- Round 2 awardee (2018)
- 13 beneficiaries
- Up to \$74,210 combined local and federal matching Medicaid funds
- Operating Healthy Families America (HFA)



Maryland Medicaid & Home Visiting Services

Home Visitors and Administrative Care Coordination Units (ACCUs)



Maryland Medicaid's Home Visiting Services (HVS) Pilot Administrative Care Coordination Units (ACCUS)

Known as the Administrative Care Coordination Unit (ACCU) - Ombudsman Program

Funded via administrative grants from Maryland Medicaid

Operated by 24 local health departments (LHDs)

Provides administrative services, not direct case management or clinical services



Maryland Medicaid's Home Visiting Services (HVS) Pilot

Role of ACCUs

Help Medicaid enrollees:

- Understand HealthChoice benefits and how to access services
- Find a primary care physician (PCP) or specialist in MCO
- Find a dentist for a child
- Link to Medicaid transportation services
- Get prescriptions filled

Explain to Medicaid enrollees:

- Their right to choose a MCO
- Health care services they can receive out of network and without a referral, such as prenatal care and family planning services
- Annual right of enrollees to change MCOs

Key Takeaways for Home Visiting Staff

Educate high-risk pregnant women and children up to two (2) years old about available Medicaid programs and services for MCH

Coordinate with ACCUs and MCOS to ensure high-risk pregnant women and children up to two (2) years old access needed health and social services

Collaborate with MCOs to establish linkages to services and programs for high-risk pregnant women and children up to two (2) years old




