# **Updated Summary of the CDC's COVID-19**

#### **Prevention Guidelines**

### March 15, 2023

#### 1. Respiratory Protection:

- A. For patients presenting with a positive COVID test or signs & symptoms consistent with COVID-19, all providers must wear a fit-tested N-95 respirator or the equivalent for any and all dental procedures.
  - a) Treatment of these patients should be deferred if possible and/or managed with palliative care until the symptoms have resolved and/or a negative COVID test provided.
  - b) If urgent care is necessary, patients should be given a facemask and put into one of the closed rooms and providers follow the above referenced respiratory protection.
- B. Patients who test negative or have no signs & symptoms consistent with COVID-19 may be treated with the following:
  - a) When providing dental treatment, a KN95 respirator is highly recommended.
  - b) A level-1 surgical mask should be used to cover the KN95 allowing use of the respirator for multiple patients;
  - c) The level-1 surgical mask is changed and disposed of between patients.

#### 2. Facial/Eye Protection:

- **A.** A full face-shield is highly recommended for any and all dental procedures, regardless of COVID-19 status.
- 3. All other Standard, Contact, Droplet and Airborne Precautions remain in effect.
