Regulations Update

Core Competencies:

- (a) Advocacy and community capacity building skills;
- (b) Effective oral and written communication skills;
- (c) Cultural competency;
- (d) Understanding of ethics and confidentiality issues;
- (e) Knowledge of local resources and system navigation;
- (f) Care coordination **support** skills;
- (g) Teaching skills to promote healthy behavior change;
- (h) Outreach methods and strategies; and
- (i) Understanding of public health concepts and health literacy.

CHW Certification Training Program Accreditation Process



Statute and Regulations

CHW Certification Training Program Accreditation

- Health-General Article, §13-3705, Annotated Code of Maryland
- COMAR 10.68.02 Community Health Worker Certification Training Programs



Training Program Requirements

COMAR 10.68.02.03 - Training Program Requirements

A CHW certification training program shall:

- Provide a minimum of 100 hours of instruction
- Verify successful completion of an additional supervised 40-hour practicum by a student
- Employ a curriculum framework that incorporates, at a minimum, the Maryland CHW nine core competencies
- Include an objective knowledge assessment



Applying for Accreditation

- A CHW certification training program that was in operation on or before October 1, 2018:
 - Will be notified by certified mail, electronic mail, or MDH website posting of the training program requirements for accreditation
 - Shall comply with accreditation requirements
 - Shall complete an application by Dec. 31, 2020
- The Department may provide technical assistance to CHW certification training programs to meet the requirements



Training Programs Training from Oct. 1, 2018 - Dec. 31, 2020

- A CHW certification training program that trained individuals from October 1, 2018
 through December 31, 2020, will be eligible to apply for accreditation for that time period if the training program:
 - Meets the CHW certified training program requirements
 - Submits an application to the Department;
 - Becomes an accredited training program; and
 - Provides a list of students who successfully completed the training program during the stated time period.

Training Program Application Process

- CHW certification training program accreditation process released January 1, 2020
- All application materials and documents will be located on website –
 https://pophealth.health.maryland.gov/Community-Health-Workers/Pages/Training-Program-Accreditation.aspx
 - Application instruction manual
 - Required forms
- Application portal via Maryland OneStop
- Technical assistance provided



Training Program Application Components

- Organization and training program information
- Evidence of a minimum of:
 - Curriculum framework that incorporates the nine CHW core competencies
 - 100 instructional hours
 - Additional supervised 40-hour practicum
 - Objective knowledge assessment
- Attestation



Application Review Committee

COMAR 10.68.02.04B – Application Review Committee

Training program applications will be reviewed by a CHW Training Program Application Review Committee consisting of:

- A community health worker;
- A State Community Health Worker Advisory Committee member;
- A health professions educator with expertise in curriculum development;
- An MDH CHW certification program staff member; and
- As deemed necessary by the Department, an MDH program staff member with subject matter expertise in specialty areas.

Application Review Committee

 Call for Review Committee members will be released in early January 2020

- Interested candidates will be required to complete an application and provide a resume / CV
- The Training Program Application Review Committee will be selected by the Secretary after review of application
- Conflict of interest disclosure



Application Review Committee

- The Review Committee will:
 - Review training program applications to determine whether a training program application meets the requirements
 - Forward recommendations for accreditation of eligible training programs to the Secretary

 Upon receipt of a completed application, the Department will make a decision regarding application within 120 calendar days.
