- Identify and convene an expert stakeholder group to consider minimum requirements for a CHW specialty certification in Chronic Disease Management: Diabetes
- Draft potential amendments to COMAR 10.68.01, 10.68.02, and now 10.68.03



## Summary of Strategic Plan

- 1. Conduct a literature review
- 2. Develop application and evaluation materials for the Expert Stakeholder Group
- 3. Select Expert Stakeholder Group members
- 4. Hold 3 Expert Stakeholder Meetings (2 hours each)
- 5. Collect and analyze feedback/recommendations from Expert Stakeholder Group



## Summary of Strategic Plan

- 6. Send recommendations out to other MDH and external subject matter experts for feedback
- 7. Use recommendations and feedback to amend the COMAR regulations
- 8. Present to CHW Advisory Committee for feedback
- 9. Complete the process for the adoption of the regulations into COMAR

### **CHW Specialty Certification: National Landscape**

State	Instruction	Experience
Rhode Island (Cardiovascular Health & Diabetes; Older Adults)	30 hours of education/training within the past 2 years on domains named by the certification board	3 months or 500 hours of paid or volunteer work experience within the past two years
<b>Indiana</b> (Recovery Specialists & Chronic Care Professional Health Coach)	40-hour, self-paced online course, post-test (80% passing)	10 hours of primary care- based experience and 10 hours of clinical experience
New Mexico (NM)	12 hours of training in a chosen specialty area.	0 hours of experience.

  7. Identify resources for individuals at risk of developing diabetes or who have been diagnosed with diabetes
- 8. Understand how diabetes affects pregnancy

Describe social determinants of health	<ul> <li>Describe social determinants of health</li> <li>Describe how health literacy and health education contribute to overall well-being</li> <li>Describe health equity</li> <li>Identify examples of health inequity</li> <li>Identify the barriers to care: social, socio-economic, educational, cultural, and environmental</li> </ul>
Describe chronic disease including self- management programs, tools and strategies	<ul> <li>List the most prevalent chronic diseases in Maryland</li> <li>Describe the importance of nutrition, exercise, and physical activity</li> <li>Describe the importance of adherence to self-management of and treatment for chronic disease</li> <li>Explain the importance of medication management and medication interactions</li> <li>Assist with crisis recognition and intervention</li> <li>Explain vital sign measures including, but not limited to: blood pressure, heart rate, respiratory rate, and temperature</li> <li>Identify disease specific tests related to specific chronic diseases (e.g. A1c, cholesterol)</li> </ul>

Chronic Disease Management: Diabetes Domains	Select skills and abilities include, but are not limited to:
1. Chronic Disease Management	Understand the community health worker domain areas for chronic disease management
2. Define prediabetes, diabetes, and types of diabetes	<ul> <li>Define prediabetes, Type 1, Type 2, and gestational <u>diabetes</u></li> <li>Identify the risk factors, demographics, clinical presentations, and diagnosis criteria for <u>diabetes</u> <ul> <li>Type 1, Type 2, gestational diabetes</li> <li>Understand how diabetes affects <u>pregnancy</u></li> </ul> </li> <li>Define A1c</li> </ul>
3. Describe the potential impacts of diabetes	<ul> <li>Systemic Complications Associated with Diabetes:</li> <li>Define stroke, heart attack, vascular disease, kidney disease, vision loss, nerve damage, metabolic complications, genitourinary disorders, erectile dysfunction, periodontal disease, pedal manifestations</li> <li>Explain how pain affects quality of life</li> <li>Encourage individuals to discuss blood, urine and other laboratory tests with their healthcare provider</li> </ul>
	Cardiovascular Health: Define heart disease Identify the signs and symptoms of heart disease Define silent heart attacks Explain how diabetes affects the heart Explain the relationship between high blood pressure, cholesterol, and diabetes Define stroke Explain the warning signs of a stroke Explain how diabetes increases the risk of having a stroke
	<ul> <li>Eye Health:</li> <li>Explain the importance of routine eye examinations for individuals with <u>diabetes</u></li> <li>Explain why complying with treatment is essential to preserve <u>vision</u></li> <li>Individuals with severe complications may need monthly <u>treatment</u></li> <li>Emphasize that high blood sugars can lead to permanent loss of <u>vision</u></li> </ul>



### **Proposed Minimum Requirements**

Domains	Minimum Requirements
Instructional Hours	25 hours
Assessment of Instructional Hours	Objective written knowledge assessment
Experience/ Practicum	A supervised practicum is required
Experience/ Practicum Hours	80 hours
Experience/ Practicum Assessment	Assessment by the supervisor/ preceptor on completion of core requirements
Renewal	20 hours of a broad range of professional development in areas related to the Domains (No assessment. CHW must show proof of completion.)
