Miranda Ouellette, MPH, CHES, Inclusion Coordinator, Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Control:

Year 1 Updates- Train

The Health Equity and Resilience Ad Hoc work group meets regularly. CHWs working in Allegany, Dorchester, and Somerset counties completed Maryland CHW certification programs. A contractor was identified to develop the Health Equity and Social Determinants of Health specialty training resources.

Year 1 Updates- Deploy

The local health departments in each of the three target jurisdictions (Allegany, Dorchester and Somerset) onboarded at least two CHWs to work on the COVID-19 response.

Year 1 Updates- Engage

The 2109 CHW Tracking Tool went live in June 2022 which captures individual client data.

<u>Year 2</u> begins August 31, 2022. Goals: Complete community resilience assessment; develop two additional specialty training curricula; work with MD healthcare organizations to expand referral services with CHWs.
