Springfield Hospital Center in Sykesville became a tobacco-free campus on January 7, 2008. At Springfield, one of Carroll County's largest employers, smoking and the use of tobacco products is not allowed anywhere on the hospital's campus. Jonathan Book, MD, Clinical Director for Springfield Hospital Center, acknowledges that the addictive nature of nicotine made it difficult for some patients and staff to make the change to a tobacco free environment, but staff worked diligently throughout 2007 to make the transition as smooth as possible. According to Dr. Book, smoking cessation counseling and nicotine replacement therapies have long been offered to patients who smoke.

"Our efforts increased as we neared the start of the tobacco free initiative. Fifty-five staff members volunteered to become trained Smoking Cessation Facilitators. They continue to be a resource for patients and other staff."
